Course Description:

Follow-up Meeting:

This course involves field trip activities to introduce students to contemporary print media and photography as it is being produced and disseminated currently in New York City. We will be visiting print studios, galleries, and museums to examine the processes, practices, and artistic/ aesthetic visions of these artists/ sites/ artworks. Students must attend all prescheduled visits, arrive punctually at the location in NYC, and may not bring liquids or food into any venues. Missing more than 1 prescheduled event will result in failure of the course.

Upon returning to Kent, each student will produce 1 written or artistic project in response to the trip. Written responses must be a minimum of 1,250 words. Remember that an academic paper has a thesis, arguments, and conclusion (this is not a travelogue!). An artistic project must represent a significant amount of time, effort, conceptual rigor, and technique (print or photography related) as well as a 1 paragraph artist statement. Not attending the final meeting or not finishing all written and project materials by the deadline will result in failure of the course.

Notes:

Bring snacks for the bus trips. The bus will not stop for food on either leg of the trip, so please pack some fruit, sandwiches, granola bars, water, etc.

Manhattan and surrounding boroughs are much larger than many realize. Plan accordingly to ensure you arrive at your destination on time. While the instructor will make every effort to help those who need directions, it is your responsibility to make the required meetings. Get a map and a Metro Card (subway pass - \$32 for the week or \$2.75 per ride) and plan on walking a lot.

NY Field Trips demand a lot of time on your feet in galleries, museums, and printshops. Often there is little seating available if any. Pace yourself. Wear comfortable shoes, bring extra pairs of clean socks, and pack a small umbrella. Pack lightly for the trip. A camera and sketchbook are both useful to remember exhibitions and artists' works and will make both writing and visual projects easier to reference later. Exchange cell phone numbers with other students on the trip.

Get a gallery guide, they are often complementary in the galleries. This publication lists many exhibitions, events, and addresses not listed here.

Remember to eat regularly and get reasonable amounts of sleep. Choosing to forego either of these will lead to an unhealthy situation. Some general suggestions are to break into smaller groups (4 or less) before asking to be seated in restaurants. Separate checks are not often accommodated. Food and drink can be expensive in NY, though not always. Remember to tip all wait staff, bartenders, and taxi drivers 15%-20%.

Do not bring bulky backpacks into museums, galleries, and printshops. Many places get very nervous about this, and may ask to search the contents and/or have you check the item. Again, travel light, especially since you will tire quickly under a weighty pack or purse.

Do not invite strangers into your room or plan to stay at a friend's apartment during the trip. Stay aware of your surroundings at all times. Do not flash money or expensive items in public places. Always travel with other students. Do not ride the subways after 11pm.

Remember: during the field study courses we all represent the university. Poor behavior reflects badly on us all. This is not a shopping trip or sightseeing tour, it is a research trip to investigate and absorb contemporary visual art practices relevant to your practice as an artist and development as a student.
